# **CHOOSE YOUR VET WISLEY!**

I can't stress the importance of finding a good vet. Through my years of dog breeding, research and my own experiences, I can assure you there are good vets and there are "not so good vets"... No different than human. Don't assume because they have DMV at the end of their name, they are going to keep your pet healthy. I have seen dogs ruined by over-vaccination and over medicated (some of my own). My approach to keeping my dogs healthy is through Natural Rearing — which means, I choose not to vaccinate (when possible), stay clear of chemicals and I feed my dogs a natural raw based diet. I utilize a team of vets: Holistic and Conventional.

The conventional vets I use are smart and dedicated...I appreciate their skills. However, most have conventional mind sets, so their advice always revolves around surgeries, prescription diets, drugs and medications. When a conventional vet gives advice, you're getting only some of the possible options – the ones he/she has been trained in.

When my dog has tests done, I listen to what my conventional vet has to say about the results. I listen to his recommendations for treatment. But then I do some research on my own. And I ask my alternative vet for recommendations. Often I decide to follow some of the recommendations from each one, combining the wisdom each brings to the table.

Don't assume **all** your dog's health care comes from solely from a vet. There's much you can do on your own to protect your dog's health to avoid health problems and **not** need to visit your veterinary team much at all. Everything your dog comes in contact with can affect his health – for better or for worse. Your goal is to make everything in your dog's daily life health-promoting. **Raising a healthy child isn't done at your doctor's office. It's done at home, with a little help from your doctor when needed. Same with raising a healthy dog.** 

Holistic Veterinary Medicine: Recognizes that a balanced immune system is a vital, healing force in an animal's body, and when immunity is supported, disease may be prevented or delayed. Holistic veterinarians conduct a comprehensive physical examination, including an animal's behavior, recent and past medical history, diet and dietary history, environment, emotional stress and other factors.

Holistic veterinarians approach medicine as treating the animal body as a biological whole — centered on preventative medicine as well as health maintenance focusing on finding and treating the root cause of disease instead of treating the symptom.

Holistic Treatment Example: An animal may develop chronic colitis after being vaccinated. Instead of dispensing antibiotics or steroids masking the symptom of bloody diarrhea, holistic vets may utilize herbs and supplemental remedies, whole food diets, homeopathy, vitamin/mineral supplementation to restore metabolic and digestive balance to make them stronger and help her resist future health problems.

Integrative Medicine: Combines both conventional and holistic veterinary practices. An integrative veterinarian studies conventional veterinary medicine but also recognizes the value of holistic medicine and realizes that both compliment and support animal wellness. An integrative veterinarian is interested in both conventional and alternative treatments; and will most likely be a member of the American Holistic Veterinary Medical Association.

Conventional/Traditional Veterinary Practice: Aimed at determining the problem and trying to solve it based on addressing symptoms, with your pet's best interest at heart, typically confined to using synthetic steroids and antibiotic medicine, which do not always solve a chronic or undetermined condition. Many times a conventional veterinarian will prescribe medication that may silence symptoms but not resolve the underlying problem.

Sadly, most owners limit themselves to a vet who doesn't offer many treatment options. For almost every health issue, conventional vets offer medications, surgery, or prescription diets. Of course, those are true lifesavers when really needed! The problem is that conventional vets have to use those treatments for everything because they haven't learned how to use any alternatives – many of which are just as effective and with fewer side effects.

## **Vaccinations: Consider Carefully**





If I had but one overarching recommendation to make to the world of animal owners, it would be this:

Learn all you can about vaccinations for your animals (and your kids!). This is anything but a benign, riskfree procedure.

As I look time and again at when my patients started their decline into poor health, I repeatedly see the timing being "about a month" after a round of vaccinations. Not in every case, but in a large percentage of my patient population, this is true.

And when I look at the homeopathic remedies needed to restore health to those who are suffering, a small group know as "vaccinosis remedies" must inevitably



be part of the prescribing path. [Vaccinosis, a hundred year old term coined by early homeopathic physicians, means simply: illness that came as a result of being vaccinated.]

When I was educated in veterinary school in the late 70's, I was not told any of this. It was not made clear to me that vaccines had any risks associated with them at all. It took years of practice, careful study of my patients, reading with an open mind, and learning from experts in natural health that this single procedure may well be the undoing of most, if not all, health. In people and their animals.

I've explored it here for you from several different angles. My hope is that, armed with this information, and what you find across the vast internet, you'll be able to choose wisely, and step very cautiously on this significant part of the Perilous Path.

Start with Vaccination: Efficacy, and read on through safety and the rest.

I am relieved that there are now research studies available that confirm that the practice of yearly dog vaccination has absolutely no scientific basis and that most dogs immunity lasts at least 8 years and possibly even a lifetime.

Vaccines are a fiery topic. All I can do is to give you my humble opinion and suggestions.

- Natural immunity obtain from the milk of mothers persist in most puppies until 12 to 16 weeks of age.
- Vaccinating puppies before 12 weeks will "wipe" out the maternal antibodies which leaves puppies more vulnerable to infections.
- Vaccines contain serious carcinogens such as <u>thiomersal</u> (that contains mercury), formaldehyde and other chemicals.
- Most people are unaware that vaccines are often produced by infecting and sacrificing
  healthy animals. To me, the notion of killing one to save another is insane and I feel
  obligated to inform you about this practice.
- Vaccines can also cause chronic often life-long disease that resembles the disease that
  they are supposed to prevent. Some good examples are digestive problems, skin issue or
  mental and behavioral changes that disappear after neutralizing the effects vaccines have
  with homeopathic remedies.
- Most vaccines bypass the natural entry gates of infection such as mouth or the airways and
  this is a severe shock to the immune system. How would you feel if a person entered your
  house through breaking the windows (the analogy for an injection) as opposed to ringing
  the bell?
- The administration of multiple antigen vaccines is also a very unnatural way of creating immunity. In nature, usually only one serious disease pathogen would be present at the time allowing the body to fully focus on one pathogen. Giving combination vaccines makes the immune system overwhelmed the same way you would if you are working on several major projects at the same time.

# It may be shocking but many healthy puppies maintain lifetime antibodies with zero vaccination except for rabies.

In my practice, I always try to avoid them whenever possible. It has been my experience that this is the best way to create healthy and long life...

# Here is an immunity protocol that I have been using in my practice for years.

- Never vaccinate your puppy before 12 weeks of age if you have the choice
- If your puppy has been vaccinated early, any medical condition may or may not be a
  vaccine side effect. I recommend consulting an open minded holistic practitioner who
  knows how to recognize vaccine-related issues.
- If you suspect vaccination side-effects you can safely administer <u>a homeopathic remedy</u>
   Thuja 200 C one dose to neutralize vaccination side effects.
- Maternal antibodies protect puppies fully until 12 16 weeks. When your puppy is 12 weeks old get a parvovirus and distemper "antibody titer test" done.
- If any antibody level is present, retest at the age of 5 months and socialize your puppy on a moderate basis with other dogs. Your puppy will learn the "ropes" by being in the company of other canines and its exposure to pathogens while it is protected will stimulate the production of their own antibodies. This is in fact natures "way of vaccination" and this is exactly what vaccine companies don't want you to know.
- To me, any level of antibodies suggests protection despite some labs reporting low titers
  as insufficient. In fact, no one can say what levels are or aren't low. I have never seen
  parvo or distemper in dogs that have had even a low positive titer.
- If your puppy tested negative for antibodies, consider vaccination with one antigen of parvovirus (not a combination) at 12 weeks and distemper four weeks later.
- Retest for antibodies one month and then two to three months after the vaccine and then two to three months later.
- If your puppy's titer continues to be negative, you will have to make a decision about which
  risk is higher boosters or the incidence of an infectious disease.
- Never use vaccines for Kennel Cough, Lyme disease and Giardia as they have the highest side-effect causing properties.
- If you live in an area with rabies, the vaccine may need to be given, however, give it at least four weeks from other vaccination and talk to your veterinarian about the rabies incidence

# WHAT TO FEED YOUR PUPPY/DOG

Another topic, that is quite controversial in the pet food industry. This is another area I have done MUCH research and attended many seminars. It all makes perfectly good common sense to me now. Species appropriate nutrition means that a creature should eat what is has always eaten... Its historical, evolutionary diet. If you are not feeding a "bones and raw food" diet (B.A.R.F. diet) to your dog, or freeze-dried raw prepared food, then canned grain-free food is best. Neither dogs or cats are suited to dry kibble. Again, dogs are no different than humans, fresh is best and variety is key.

#### Stop Feeding Your Pet "Fast Food"

Dry and canned pet foods may sound healthy but are actually designed for the pet owner's convenience and maximum shelf life instead of nutrition for their pet. Whether you feed your pet from a bag or can, these heavily-processed foods share similar shortcomings:

- > Cooking and high pressure processing destroys most of the vital enzymes and vitamins in the ingredients.
- > A small percentage of the lost nutrients are replaced by synthetic additives but even these are not easily absorbed by your pet.
- > Cheap ingredients including grains and fillers add calories but are actually difficult for pets to digest.
- > Protein levels can look good on the label but can also come from difficult to digest sources.
- > Heavily-processed pet foods contain preservatives for long-term storage in warehouses and retail stores. Preservatives not only depletes micronutrients but have been connected with many common allergies such as yeast on the skin, paws and in the ears.

**Start Feeding Your Pet Real Food:** No preservatives. No high-pressure processing. No synthetic additives. No hormones. No antibiotics. No grains, no fillers. Your pet's digestive system is designed for whole foods with nutrients in their natural form. Raw meals are created to compliment your pet's nutritional needs.

#### The Ancestral Side of Raw Food and Why It's Important

The concept of the ancestral diet for dogs and cats stems from the fact that dogs and cats have evolved successfully through hunting and scavenging – consuming foods that were high in protein and low in carbohydrates and not at all like the kibble so many are fed today.

#### WEANING PUPPIES NATURALLY — BY DR. PETER DOBIAS, DVM

Just recently, I saw a mother at Wholefoods feeding her baby by squeezing baby food from a tube. I watched her and wondered if she knew that this "baby food" had a fraction of the nutritional value of fresh food that she could blend and prepare fresh at home.

It is an example of how blinded we have been by marketing and advertising. Many people are convinced that feeding sterilized, pasteurized food is somehow better. However, nature doesn't make baby or puppy food and that is why I recommend feeding puppies the same high-quality raw food as you would feed an adult.

Starting at three to four weeks of age, you can introduce high-quality raw food by feeding the mothers in the pen with puppies that will gradually start eating it. By the time puppies are eight weeks old and ready to come home, they should be eating a variety of meats, veggies, eggs and chewing on raw bones to massage their gums and promote healthy teeth and bone development.

After more than a decade of feeding and recommending a raw, species appropriate diet, my clients and I have witnessed an enormous difference between dogs fed processed and raw food. I have repeatedly seen longer lives, less medical issues, shinier and healthier coats, better mobility, less chronic disease and cancer, there is no way I would switch back to kibble.

# Freeze-Dried Raw

















#### Raw bones provide a highly digestible source of calcium, phosphorus and other minerals. Feeding bones makes the stomach muscle layers stronger which prevents bloat. Bones also have a cleansing effect as they provide roughage in the diet and bulk for healthy

bowel movements.

Feeding raw bones also prevents anal gland problems. The bowel movements after feeding bones are harder which helps express anal glands and get rid of toxins. Chewing on raw bones keeps our dogs, especially the puppies and adolescents, occupied.

Which bones should you feed? Avoid feeding beef, buffalo or bison shank bones as

they are often harder than dog's teeth. Larger dogs can get carried away chewing on a large bone and may crack one of their teeth. This is how a two dollar marrow bone can turn into a painful and expensive adventure. Nature intended canines to hunt for birds, rodents, rabbits, goats and perhaps deer. Most dogs would not dare go anywhere near a buffalo or a cow and if they did, these large animals would not be the mainstay of their diet.

The right sized bones can save Fido a lot of dental trouble and save you money. It is recommend feeding lamb or goat bones, (I feed chicken necks and wings), twice a week. The abrasive action of these hard, but not too thick, bones are perfect for

keeping your dog's teeth shiny without the risk of dental fractures.

How about chicken bones and the bones that splinter? Feeding these bones are safe only if they are raw. Dogs have evolved very strong stomach and intestinal walls and the fear of intestinal perforation is just another myth invented by pet food companies.

Check with your local butcher, or, a quality pet shop where you can find suitable bones for Fido.

I will pick up a pack of chicken wings while at the store — my dogs love them.

# **MY TOP DOG FOOD PICKS**

What makes a good kibble? I'm not sure there is a perfect kibble, become a label reader avoiding fillers (I also recommend GMO free when possible). Today, more than ever, people are demanding non-gmo, and the choices are growing to meet the demand. Make your Kibble even better — Below are suggestions to make the kibble healthier.

Quality Kibble & Canned

Canned dog food typically contain more meat protein than dry and they're made with fewer carbohydrates. Due to air-tight packaging, canned foods contain no synthetic preservatives. So, fats and oils sealed inside cans don't easily become rancid. And no artificial flavorings and colorings. With cans, meat ingredients are closer to their natural state. So, canned products are more palatable — and more appetizing.















































1) Soak kibble in warm water and let it get soft — 70% of a dogs diet is moisture, which is lacking from processed kibble this will also aid in absorption. 2) Add digestive enzymes. 3) Combine raw or freeze dried meaty parts of chicken, fish, beef or turkey (keep the same protein mixes the same... If your feeding beef kibble, add raw beef, fish kibble, ad fish...Etc). 4) Add raw or lightly steamed vegetables: This provides an antioxidant boost for all dogs, especially if they're older or overweight. Raw veggies should be finely grated, ground in a blender or food processor, or juiced so the cellulose is broken down. 5) Add some oils for essential fatty acids: Salmon oil is great for all dogs, containing essential fatty acids to strengthen the immune system, improve inflammatory conditions such as allergies and arthritis, and beautify skin and coat. 6) Don't forget the bones of young poultry are soft and pliable enough to be eaten whole, including wings, necks and backs. Raw bones provide calcium and other minerals in the proper ratios, as well as proteins, fats, and many other valuable nutrients. Puppies will benefit from both the added nutrition and the healthy chewing outlet. Examples: Ground chicken backs, whole and ground turkey necks, Natural Pet Pantry whole duck and chicken necks, and chicken wings.

When is enough... How far do you go? Like humans, you will find an array of supplements designed to promote optimal health — the same goes for doggies. **PUMKIN FOR DIGESTIVE HEALTH** Canned natural pumpkin is a great source of fiber and helps with

digestive regularity. If your dog is experiencing constipation or diarrhea, mix a tablespoon of pumpkin straight from the can into their normal food. The seed is also a natural wormer, believed to contain a deworming compound used to expel tapeworms and roundworms.

Best way to store pumpkin is in the freezer since it will only last a week in the refrigerator. Scoop pumpkin into an ice cube tray, freeze, and pop out the cubes into a freezer bag. Thaw when you need it, mix with your pet's next meal. If you don't want to retrieve pumpkin cubes from the freezer every other day, count out a week's worth of servings into small freezer containers.











# **DOG TOYS WE LIKE**





# WHAT KIND OF CRATE?

My dogs LOVE their crates. It's their safe zone, a place they can escape and feel safe. It's not a punishment. I like to drape a blanket over the crate so it feels more like a cave — more privacy. As they grow and get larger, I like the large crate so they can comfortably stretch out and relax.



**Note:** The crate is the safest place, and preferably where you can monitor them. If they are really fussy and they will not settle down, first, make sure they are OK, but then, if still not wanting to fall asleep, you might try taking a sheet and cover the crate completely. Note: if you take them out of the crate when they fuss, they will learn that fussing gets them out of the kennel. Wait until they are quiet, then take them out. They will adjust. Train them to go into the crate with treats/kibble. The crate should be a happy place for them, not punishment. Soft music may help. Locate the kennel in a quite part of your home where the puppy is not distracted by visitors (much like an infant).

**How long can I keep my puppie in the Kennel:** Rule of thumb is **one hour** for every month old your puppy is. This means, if your puppy is eight weeks old (2 months), thats two hours. They say you can add one hour to each month, which would be a three hour max at two months. When you first get your puppy, you will likely be getting up once or twice at night to let them out to potty.

**Tip:** Put Pumpkin inside this toy (right) and freeze it... this will keep them busy for a while and help them enjoy and adjust to the crate. We find this toy/treat to be safe from choking hazards. Remember to always monitor your puppy with toys, they are no different than a Baby:)





If you must leave your puppy for a longer period of time: Set up a puppy area using a pen with a crate inside, with dishes and potty area. You can order these wire playpens on Amazon or FleetFarm carries them as well.

Digging comes very natural for many dogs. Digging is frequently a "hard-wired" behavior in dogs and stopping it is literally trying to stop a dog's natural tendencies. So.... Instead of Fighting the Instinct to dig, harness it!

One of the most effective ways to deal with instinctual dog behavior like digging is to give a dog a way to do it that is not disruptive. My favorite is to set up a "digging pit" somewhere and then convince the dog that digging there is more rewarding than around the petunias. Dig a hole and fill it with sand. (Sand is a lot easier to clean up than soil.) it may be helpful to hide some toys in the sand and show your dog his new place to dig! Start out making the hidden goodies easy to find and then work your way up to making it more and more difficult. Make it a game, and be sure to spend some time with your dog. Which is a nice segway to the next point.....

#### Idle Paws are the Devil's Digger!

Are you leaving a "known offender" alone in your yard? Leaving your dog alone outside is not a good idea for a lot of reasons, but leaving a bonafide digger alone is just asking for it. Even when you are with your dog, his eyes may wander over to those petunias. This is a prime opportunity to train him to leave things alone on cue. That, along with some work on impulse control, will make it easier to redirect your dog's attention to more productive pursuits.

Left to their own devices, dogs may not choose the recreation activities we would prefer. Trying playing with your dog instead of leaving him alone. Trying using toys and games to exercise his mind and redirect his desire to dig.

Digging can be a big nuisance, but it's not an insurmountable problem. Try these steps and remember: enjoy your time with your dog. That why's you got him!

REMEMBER: YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR TEACHING YOUR DOG THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE DIGGINGPIT AND THE REST OF THE YARD. That was in all caps not because I am yelling, but because it is essential.
